Academy is a new school startup in the Davenport area. In their most recent Founders Update Newsletter, Fort McHenry shared some exciting news about their new school startup and a partnership with Hillsdale College in opening a regional training center in Iowa attached to their school!



From Fort McHenry's newsletter:

"On May 21st, Dr. Larry Arnn, President of Hillsdale College, addressed a room full of supporters in downtown Davenport. He spoke of Fort McHenry's efforts to move forward with the school and Hillsdale's plans for the attached regional training center. This is an announcement we have been waiting a long time to confirm and share with our community. The regional training center will serve schools and

teachers across the midwest, making Scott County a critical piece of the progression of classical instruction throughout the heartland.

Scott County will be the 3rd regional training center for Hillsdale. There is one in Connecticut and another being built now in California."

Fort McHenry Classical Academy is a private Christian Hillsdale College K12 Curriculum School in Scott County, IA providing an American Classical education that is content-rich across four disciplines: Math, Science, English Language Arts (including phonics, grammar and writing), and History, with significant attention to music, art, and foreign language. They plan to open their doors in Fall 2026.

ESA Reminders

ESA applications will be open until June 30. ESA information can be found on the Iowa Department of Education's website: https://educate.iowa.gov/pk-12/educational-choice/education-savings-accounts

Qualifications for the 24-25 school year for ESAs include:

- All incoming K students
- All public school or homeschool students who transfer to a Christian school, regardless of income
- Students who qualified for the ESA this year (no matter the income) "once in, always in" a reminder that parents still need to apply on Odyssey every year
- Students in families who are 400% of the poverty level and lower
